Teacher candidates have two opportunities to pass the state assessment, which is a program completion requirement as well as a practicum prerequisite. Consequently, 100% of all program completers pass the state assessment in their endorsement area(s). Since its creation in 2002, The Alternate Routes to Certification Program, which leads to a Masters of Arts in Teaching degree, has developed field-base courses which are individualized to assist the candidate in
